

Dr. Daisy Khan, D.Min

"I am an active member of the Muslim community who is committed to the shared values of Islam and America which I see as mutually reinforcing. As a faith-based activist, I have fielded three broad questions about Islam that continue to shadow most conversations. These questions center on the status of women in Islam, the lack of effective Muslim leadership (young and old) and the challenge of extremism and Islamophobia confronting Muslims in America.

As co-founder and former Executive Director of American Society for Muslim Advancement I dealt directly with the challenges of living as a Muslim in the post-9/11 world and in response-built bridges of understanding between faith communities. To fill the vacuum in youth leadership I convened and networked an impressive cadre of 500 young Muslim leaders from around the globe. As founder of Women's Islamic Initiative in spirituality and Equality, I amplify the voices of Muslim women on the frontlines advocating for women's rights, religious pluralism, and peacebuilding.

As a spiritual activist, I stand true to the divine purpose which is human diversity, aimed at promoting peace, harmony and cooperation between peoples and nations. Strategically, I leverage the power of faith to combat deep-seated social ills and use Islam's egalitarian teachings to promote societal common good and its spiritual values to unite, transform, and actualize wisdom in the spiritual lives of people.

Bio-Speaker, Author, Impact leader, Women's advocate, Interfaith promoter

**Daisy Khan** is an award-winning speaker, author, activist, commentator, and the founder of Women's Islamic Initiative in Spirituality and Equality (WISE), the largest global network of Muslim women committed to peacebuilding, gender equality, and human dignity.

She has been involved in grassroots efforts combating anti-Muslim bias for over twenty years and is renowned as a thought leader on Muslim women's rights, Islam in America. As a bridge builder she has been hailed for producing interfaith programs like *Same Difference*, the *Cordoba Bread Fest* and the "Today, I am a Muslim Too" rally.

Khan believes that women's leadership is essential to solving societal issues. "we need to remove structural barriers to Muslim women's leadership, to enable them to use their resolve, passion and humility to bring societies into greatness." She founded the first global Muslim women's Shura (advisory) Council to amplify Muslim women's scholarship. The Council uses an egalitarian interpretation of scripture to publish position papers against pressing issues such as child marriage, domestic violence, female genital mutilation, terrorism, and many others.

Khan published *WISE Up-* knowledge end extremism in collaboration with 72 authors to create a counter-momentum to the rise in hateful rhetoric and violent extremism. Her memoir, **Born with Wings**, published in 2018 by Random House, depicts her spiritual journey as a modern Muslim woman and her circuitous path to leadership. In 2022 Khan will publish "30 Rights of Muslim Women, in Islam, Quran and Shariah and WISE UP- White Supremacy, what White America can learn from the experience of Muslims fighting extremism.

Khan is a prolific speaker who has lectured at major institutions, like Council on Foreign Relations, Aspen Institute, Chautauqua Institution, World Economic Forum, Islamic society of North America and many others. She is a media commentator and an Op-Ed writer who has appeared on CNN, MSNBC, ABC, PBS, and BBC and is featured in documentaries and publications like TIME, Guardian, Newsweek, New York Times, Wall Street Journal, Elle, and many others.

Khan was listed among TIME Magazine's "100 Most Influential" People and *The Huffington Post* listed her among "Top Ten Women Faith leaders" and *MORE Magazine* described her as "a link between moderate Islam and the West." She is the recipient of twenty awards and honors including the Eleanor Roosevelt Human Rights Award, Edinburgh Peace Award, Interfaith Center's Award for Promoting Peace, *Women's E-News* named her "21 women of the 21st century." *Glamour Magazine* listed her among "7 Women You Must Follow on Twitter."

Born in Kashmir, she spent twenty-five years as an interior architect for various Fortune 500 companies. In 2005, she dedicated herself to full-time community service and building movements for positive change, both in the United States and around the globe.

# Women's Empowerment

Khan founded WISE (Women's Islamic Initiative on Spirituality & Equality) to build solidarity among Muslim women leaders and to advance the role of Muslim women in contemporary society. WISE fulfills its ambitions through a four-prong change theory.

**1. Global convenings** – assembling WISE women from more than 40 countries.



2. Global Muslim Women's Shura Council, a consensus council which publishes position papers to provide an egalitarian interpretation to scripture for pressing societal on women's and human rights such as Jihad Against Violence- a condemnation of domestic violence and terrorism, Female Genital Cutting: Harmful and Un-Islamic, child and forced marriage and Adoption and Care of Orphaned Children.



**3. Grassroots projects**- Mobilization of imams to promote women's rights led by Muslim women to tackle Female Genital Cutting (FGC), domestic violence, and child marriage.

The event was held at the Cathedral Church of Saint John the Divine in New York City on a snowy day

in January and **brought out 600 New Yorkers** for an evening of sharing poetry, music, sculptures, and paintings.

#### January 2003 - Same Difference - Theatre


A Theater Project to Shed Light on Stereotyping After 9/11

Three women, Jewish, Christian and Muslims came together to develop a theater program to focus on interfaith relations before and after September 11, 2001. The entire play was composed of interviews of average New Yorkers on their views as to why the attacks happened. With theater as the medium of expression, the audience heard often harsh truths in the words of community members spoken by a third person (the actor) in a safe environment. This allowed the audience to get closer to the meat of community dissonance and conflicts more readily than would normally be possible. The show was sold-out audiences for over 16 weeks.




# November 2006 - 7 Women 7 Heavens - Theatre


The world premiere of the play took place during the launch of the WISE initiative on November 2006 to a packed audience of WISE participants and members of the larger New York City community.

WISE Up, knowledge ends Extremism is a 365-page knowledge resource and toolkit to aid communities in achieving the interconnected and mutually reinforcing goals of 1) countering the spread of extremist ideologies, which distort the peaceful teachings of Islam, and 2) countering the harmful effects of misinformation about Islam and Muslims, which have led to rising Islamophobia and an increase in anti-Muslim hate crimes.
